

January 2006

On January 21, 2006, Warren Police Officers Kevin Borycz and Robert Horlocker responded to a shooting at 28685 Ryan Rd. Warren PD Dispatch broadcast that the suspects, 2 Asian males, fled the scene in a white SUV.

Officer Borycz over heard a witness state that the suspect had called the victim on his cell phone just prior to the shooting. Officers Borycz and Horlocker retrieved the suspects cell phone number from the victims phone and had Warren PD Dispatch contact the cellular carrier and have them get the real time location of the cell phone.

With the assistance of the cellular carrier, Officers Borycz and Horlocker were able to successfully track the suspects and eventually affect a traffic stop. The suspects were identified, arrested and the weapon was recovered without further injury to any of the involved parties.

It is for this reason that Officers Borycz and Horlocker have been selected as the FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officers of the month.

February 2006

On February 1, 2006, Warren Police Detective Stephen Mills was driving south on Van Dyke near 12 Mile Rd when he saw two men running down Van Dyke. The lead subject was carrying a box while the second man appeared to be pursuing him. Detective Mills contacted Dispatch to see if there were any in-progress crimes in the area. He saw the subject drop the box at Stanley and Van Dyke and he pursued and apprehended the subject. It was later learned that the man had stolen over \$1,500 in jewelry from the Catholic Supply House on 12 Mile Rd.

Thanks to Detective Mills' alert, fast actions, the stolen property was recovered and the suspect was arrested. It is for this reason that Detective Mills has been selected as the FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officer of the month.

On February 20, 2006, Warren Police Officers Steve Campbell and Mike Sauger were flagged down by a citizen whom reported that he had seen a subject on Continental that he believed to be wanted by Police. The citizen had no further information.

The Officers checked the area and located three suspicious subjects. As the officers performed a "terry-pat down" for officer safety, a .38 caliber revolver was recovered from one of the subjects.

A check of the firearm on LEIN revealed that the gun was registered to a Centerline Officer. Officers Campbell and Sauger were able to contact the Centerline officers brother, a Warren Police Officer, and determine that the gun had been stolen in a burglary that was undiscovered at the officers house. The subjects were arrested and another firearm that was taken in the burglary was later recovered.

It is for this reason that Officers Campbell and Sauger have been selected as FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officers of the month.

March 2006

On 03/05/06 Warren Po Dave Maye was making a routine check of Al Long Ford, which had recently be victimized by several larcenies. PO Maye observed a Ford van parked next to a large hole in the fenced in storage lot. An investigation of the van revealed that it was stolen. It was occupied by a lone juvenile driver, and 12 new Ford wheels and tires where in the rear of the van.

PO Maye called for back up and continued to search the area for additional suspects. PO Maye was able chase down an adult male that he had found in the yard. Both subjects were arrested, and the stolen property recovered. The adult male is likely responsible for numerous other larcenies in the city of Warren.

It is for this reason the Warren Po Dave Maye is the FOP Lodge 124 Peace Officer of the year.

April 2006

On the evening of 03/17/06, Officers Mike Moore and Craig Kirby responded to a rollover accident at Nine Mile Rd and Groesbeck. When they arrived, they found a vehicle that had been involved in a high-speed crash up against a utility pole. The vehicle was on fire and the driver was trapped inside. Realizing that the fire was growing, the officers cut the seatbelt of the unconscious driver and removed him from the vehicle, pulling him to safety.

It is for this reason the Warren PO's Mike Moore and Craig Kirby are the FOP Lodge 124 Peace Officers of the month.

May 2006

On May 7, 2006 Officer Randall Richardson was checking the area of 13 Mile and Hayes for an armed robbery suspect vehicle when dispatch broadcast that another R/A, with the same suspect vehicle information, had just occurred at the Speedway gas station at 13 Mile and Van Dyke. Richardson stopped a vehicle matching the suspect vehicle information. The driver of the vehicle appeared extremely nervous. It was determined that the driver may have been involved with the R/A. Further investigation discovered two armed suspects in the trunk of the vehicle. All three suspects were arrested, Richardson and WPD midnight shift recovered the weapon and stolen property. It is for this reason that Randall Richardson is the FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officer of the month.

June 2006

Detective Michael Kroll conducted a lengthy investigation of a former doctor's employee who was obtaining prescription drugs fraudulently as well as endorsing and cashing Blue Cross/Blue Shield insurance checks made out to the doctor. These crimes were committed over a three-year period, with the suspect receiving well over a million dollars through her thefts.

Thanks to Detective Kroll's painstaking attention to detail and persistence a nine-count warrant was authorized for the woman. The FBI is also conducting a separate investigation of this woman's activities.

It is for this reason that Detective Michael Kroll is the FOP Lodge 124 Peace Officer of the month.

July 2006

On July 13, Detective Tim Maniere was in the parking lot of White Castle at 6711 Eight Mile Rd when he observed a suspicious black male subject ride a bicycle through the lot and approach a gray GMC Envoy occupied by a female. Detective Maniere then heard the subject yell at the woman to get out of the car. She pled with the subject for her children, who were seated in the rear seat of the vehicle. While Detective Maniere notified Dispatch of the attempt car jacking, the subject fought with the driver for control of the vehicle. He was able to enter the vehicle and fled the parking lot. Detective Maniere followed the vehicle and kept Dispatch informed on the direction of travel. As the vehicle crossed Eight Mile near Sherwood, it was involved in an accident with two other vehicles. The suspect fled on foot with Detective Maniere in foot pursuit. He caught the suspect at Sherwood and Savage in Detroit, and with the assistance of Officer Charles Rushton took the suspect into custody.

A subsequent investigation revealed that the suspect had stolen the vehicle containing the female and her three small children. The suspect was charged with multiple felony charges and received a million dollar bond. It is for this reason that Detective Tim Maniere and Officer Charles Rushton are FOP Lodge #124 Officers of the month.

On July 14, 2006 Centerline Public Safety officer Daniel Merciez responded to the area of Van Dyke and Voerner on a suicidal subject. Merciez found a subject covered in blood and armed with a knife. Because of his calm demeanor Merciez was able to disarm the subject and administered first aid.

The subject was transported to Bi-County Hospital where he underwent treatment for non-life threatening injuries.

August 2006

On August 1, Sergeant David Dismuke was on patrol in the area of Schoenherr and 9 Mile, when he saw a vehicle leaving the 7-11 parking lot at a high rate of speed, and noticed that the clerk inside the store had his hands above his head. Dismuke alerted Dispatch and attempted to stop the fleeing vehicle. Officer Marty Kerr made the 7-11 and discovered that an armed robbery had occurred.

Dismuke and the WPD midnight shift continued to pursue the fleeing vehicle. After a lengthy chase, the pursuit was ended by Officer Roland Bell at 11 Mile and Jefferson. All three suspects were arrested; the gun and safe were recovered with no injuries to any of the involved parties.

It is for this reason that Sergeant Dave Dismuke, Officer Roland Bell and Officer Marty Kerr are FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officers of the Month.

September 2006

On 09-17-06 Warren Police Officer's responded to a residence in Warren where a domestic assault, with gunshots fired, had occurred on the previous day. The suspect had threatened to kill his family and had an extensive criminal history involving gang activity and attempted murder.

The responding officers made contact with the family members to check on their welfare. They directed officers to the basement, where the suspect was located. Officer's Scott Salibury, Rick Schnur, Geoff Ala and Scott Taylor entered the basement, where the

suspect produced a hand gun and pointed it at the officers. The officers fired at the suspect fatally wounding him. None of the officers or family members were injured.

Because of the officers commendable actions in a life threatening situation, Officer's Scott Salisbury, Rick Schnur, Geoff Ala and Scott Taylor are FOP Lodge 124 Peace Officers of the month.

October 2006

On October 31, 2006 Warren Police Officers Steve Binkowski and Gary Muller were having lunch along with other Officers during a break in their training. Officer Muller began choking on a meatball and gestured that he could not breathe. Officer Binkowski immediately performed the Heimlich maneuver, which dislodged the meatball. Officer Muller then started breathing on his own. It is for this reason the Officer Steve Binkowski is FOP Lodge #124 Peace Officer Of The Month.

On 10-17-06 Warren police officers Kevin Borycz and John Swatowski were making a routine check of the 7-11 at Schoenherr and 9 Mile. The doors of the store were locked and officers could see the cashier. The cashier was acting strange and the officers determined that a possible armed robbery was in progress. The officers notified dispatched and requested back up. Officers Borycz and Swatowski positioned themselves around the building. Officers Charles Springer and Ron Visbara arrived on scene and also positioned themselves around the building.

Two armed suspects exited the store. When confronted by the officers, the suspects produced their weapons and the officers fired upon the suspects critically wounding them. Officer Visbara was non-critically wounded in the gunfight, and has made a full recovery.

Because of the officers commendable actions in a life threatening situation, that they are FOP Lodge 124 Peace Officers of the Month.
